Weddings are always joyful happy occasions in every age and culture the world over. The wedding feast at Cana was no different. For all in the village this was a huge social event to which Mary and Jesus had been invited. Families put themselves in the public arena to be judged by their peers. Failure to measure up might mean that they could never hold their heads high again among their friends and neighbours. Cana was a small close knit community. "Remember the day the wine ran out at so-and-so's wedding", would be duly entered in the annals of the village.

Mary noticed the embarrassment of this young couple in today's story from the beginning of John's gospel. She speaks to Jesus, whom she knew could do something about it. 'They have no wine,' and told the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'....'Fill the jars with water'....the steward tasted the water and it had turned into wine. Notice today the last line in today's gospel reading: "This was the first of the signs(= Miracles) given by Jesus....He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him" The wedding feast of Cana is the Fourth Epiphany linking this Sunday with the birth of Christ in the stable Bethlehem when the angels appeared to the shepherds singing Glory to God on the highest.

The second epiphany.....the star that guided the three wise men who brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And the Baptism of Jesus by John on the river Jordan. Jesus reveals his identity, his divinity and lets us see just how much God rejoices in us as his bride. He is the Bridegroom.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine'. Jesus said,

'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants. 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him
