## Unity in Diversity

It is true to claim that the world has become a global village. The rapid transformation in all sectors of society that has taken place over the past fifty years has become mind boggling. There is clear evidence of the massive changes even here in our local communities, be they political, cultural or various sectors of our interaction. No longer can we claim to be an isolated island in Western Europe. In spite of the fact that we are a member of the European Union, we still witness areas of division.

We in the English Speaking Christian West have this understanding of our oneness in Christ ingrained in our culture and philosophies for thousands of years.

St. Francis of Assisi during his lifetime met with the Sultan Al-Kamili and after dialogue each of them recognised the other as brothers in faith and children of the same God. Charles de Foucauld once made a statement 'We don't have a monopoly on God' and likewise our present Pope Francis said 'Unlike this disagreement and conflict, persistent and

courageous dialogue does not make headlines but quietly helps the world to live much better than we imagined'.

Despite some more recent racial and cultural conflicts that lead to violence there is a quiet, a new venture abroad calling for a different mode of presence to another great tradition not with a view to conversion but with a view to creating deep moulded relationships between faith traditions. From the viewpoint of our Christian Family and those who serve in the Gospel Traditions, it seems imperative that we must grow into a dynamic of a new initiative already in many parts of the non Christian World.

Vast numbers of people are deeply shaped by their own distinct faith traditions. Despite the pluralism, there are to be found significant commitments amongst religious leaders for purpose and unification.

All our religious values must be affirmed and revered in mutual appreciation to what we refer to as inter religious dialogue. It is a necessary part of humanity's journey to seek the Kingdom of God.

## Peter & Paul



Tuesday 29th June is the feast of SS Peter & Paul. Both saints are patrons of our Cathedral. Bishop Fintan will celebrate the 11am Mass on Tuesday.

Today we honour two men different in character but united by their burning love for Jesus Christ.

Peter—a fisherman, impetuous, headstrong, the first to be called by Christ, yet denies that he even knows Him when challenged by a servant girl. He overcomes this failure to become the leader of the early Church.

So Peter is no cardboard figure who can do no wrong: he is a man aware of his own sinfulness but aware also of the power of God at work in Jesus.

Paul—an intellectual, yet a man of burning passion and commitment. At first this energy was channelled into suppressing Christ's Followers. After his conversation Paul used it to spread the Christian message through the Roman World. He wanted everyone to share in Christ's Victory over sin and death.

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the  
other side, a large crowd gathered round him  
and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of  
the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by  
name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and  
pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little  
daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay  
your hands on her to make her better and  
save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large  
crowd followed him; they were pressing all  
round him.

While he was still speaking some people  
arrived from the house of the synagogue  
official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put  
the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus

and mother and his own companions, he  
went into the place where the child lay. And  
taking the child by the hand he said to her,  
'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell  
you to get up.' The little girl got up at once  
and began to walk about, for she was  
twelve years old. At this they were  
overcome with astonishment, and he  
ordered them strictly not to let anyone know  
about it, and told them to give her  
something to eat.
