Called to Serve

On Tuesday of last week Pope Francis announced the appointment of Ennis priest, Monsignor Séamus Horgan, as Apostolic Nuncio to South Sudan and at the same time naming him as Titular Archbishop of Árd Sratha.

This great honour is not only a reflection of the dedicated service of Monsignor Horgan but also an affirmation of the faith of this community that nurtured and fostered his priestly vocation. We are justifiably proud of the trust that the Holy Father has placed in Monsignor Séamus and recall with deep affection his parents Denis and Pauline and their commitment to the life of this parish.

Educated in Ennis National School and St. Flannan's College Séamus entered Maynooth in 1987 and was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Michael Harty on the 11th June 1994 in this Cathedral and with God's help we will have the joy of witnessing his consecration as bishop here during the summer.

He served in the parishes of Bodyke and Roscrea before going to Rome for further studies in Canon Law and having achieved a
