THE MYSTERY OF GOD

Two men, both very spiritual men and great thinkers, were walking along the seashore. As they walked they discussed the mystery of God. Each was convinced that the other was making a poor job of explaining what God meant to him.

Suddenly they came upon a small boy playing by the water's edge. He had dug a small hole in the sand and kept running down to the sea, dipping his toy bucket in the water, and running back up the beach to empty the water into the hole. They watched him for some time as he ran backwards and forwards emptying and filling his bucket. They found the scene amusing, so they went up to him and asked him what he was doing. The child pointed to the sea and told them, very seriously, that he was going to take all the water in it and pour it into the hole he had dug in the sand.

The two men smiled and went on their way, carrying on their discussion about God Suddenly, however; one of them stopped and said: "You know, we were amused just now when that child told us what he was trying to do. Yet what we have been trying to do in our discussion about God is just the same. It is just as impossible for us to understand the mystery of God as it is for that child to put all the water of the sea into that hole. Our minds are but tiny thimbles, whereas the reality of God is as great as the ocean".

The Trinity is of course a mystery. Yet even a child can grasp it.

We think of God as a Father, a Father who cares deeply about us. We think of Jesus as a Brother who died for us. We think of the Holy Spirit

as a Friend and Comforter. Like fish in the sea, or birds in the air, this becomes the very atmosphere in which the Christian prays and lives.



Today we celebrate the Feast of the Blessed Trinity. It is the deepest of all Christian mysteries. The Church spent many years devising a formula for this mystery. We believe that there is only one God but there are three persons God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Ghost in God. Human reason cannot understand this, but Jesus Christ came on earth and explained this to us. In Baptism God comes to dwell in us. This feast reminds us that after death we will live in the presence of the Trinity for all eternity. In Confirmation we are given the mission to be faithful to our Faith and to proclaim Jesus to the world. The Sign of the Cross, the Glory be to the Father and Church Blessings are the usual devotions to the Blessed Trinity which are recited many times daily.
