TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMEYear B23rd June, 2024

How to make sense of this calming of the storm? To take the story literally, (and why not?), the great power of Jesus to sleep in the middle of the storm and with a few words calm the raging elements, is quite impressive on both counts. What does it mean for me? I can stay at the surface level of this story - whatever storm of theological debate is going on – and simply say, look at the power of Jesus, miracles do happen, nothing more is needed than that belief.

But there is more for everyone to see here. The gospel always leads to us towards God and invites us to a greater understanding of the relationship between God and us. There is a story told about Mahatma Gandhi who made a voyage to South Africa to oppose a law that was responsible for much racial hatred. When he arrived, there was a hostile mob waiting for him and he was advised to stay on board the ship. He ignored the advice and went ashore and was attacked physically. When asked later why he had made the choice to go he replied that while he had indeed been badly beaten and kicked, he had not prayed for safety but for courage to face the mob and that courage had come and had not failed him.

We all have fears; about sickness, about our future, careers, relationships and much more. Burrowed deep inside us, even as we sleep, those fears, which may seem small to some but are still our fears, are present. What do we do? We pray that we may avoid those dangers, we pray that we may be safe, healthy; whatever we can to avoid it. Lord, help me win the lotto so that I can pay my way to avoid trouble.

Would it be possible that what we hear in the Gospel, indeed what we hear from Job in that first reading, is a call to pray for courage to face our fears. We can't always be safe and secure but to have courage is to be able to face the storm. To have courage that the love of Christ will overwhelm us when we need it most is not easy, but it's a good starting point for our prayer.

The Feast of the Birth of John the Baptist will be celebrated Monday next 24 June. He is mentioned in the Scriptures as the precursor of Christ. He had the duty of preparing the way of the Lord.
