‘Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet’ (Mt 22:9)

Just imagine receiving an invitation to something you really said you would have liked to go to. Then it happens!!! An invitation is given and you are over the moon. Very often when an invitation is received our reaction is ‘How thoughtful of them to remember me’. Not being forgotten but recognised and invited.

One of the moments of learning whilst working with the Columban Missionaries in South America was when a local woman shared with me how much she appreciated the fact that people in Ireland, a country so far away, weren't forgetting about her and her community. She was buoyed by the fact that she was not forgotten even though she was poor, marginalised and most of the time seen as a nuisance by her own country and officialdom.

Such a reaction opened up for me an insight into what being missionary means. Whilst the image may well be of a person setting out from their own home place and going to another country as a true missionary. This new insight allowed another angle to emerge namely that we are all missionary when we support through our prayers, faith expression and even our material generosity. In many ways we are saying to an unknown person and community

that we are with you and have not forgotten you. Our world is so interdependent or even we could call it a village that whatever happens in one part of the planet has an impact on other parts.

So, when you hear the word missionary, please picture the woman whom I mentioned earlier and know that our small or not so small acts of kindness, our prayers and our support do send out a message of recognition in our response to the words in Matthew's gospel;

‘Go and invite Everyone to the Banquet’.
(Mt 22:9)

Brother Lar Nevin
1930 – 2024



Tom Laurence Nevin was born on the 5th November, 1930 in Co. Wicklow. As a teenager he joined the Christian Brothers and trained as teacher. He made his solemn profession as a Brother in 1954. His teaching life brought him to every county in Munster, coming to Ennis in 1978 as Principal of Rice College and local Superior of the Christian Brothers' Community. where he led the development and expansion of the school. He was a very gentle and efficient administrator.

On leaving Ennis in 1984 he went to Rome and on returning to Ireland continued his teaching ministry, retiring in 1995 to Syngé Street CBS in Dublin.

In May, 2013 he moved to Kiltarnan Nursing Home, Wicklow where he died peacefully on Thursday 10th October, 2024.

In the words of Blessed Edmund Rice, on his death bed, the founder of the Christian Brothers:

"Praise be thee O Christ."

Our sympathy to his surviving sister Pauline and the Christian Brothers' community on the death of Bro. Nevin. May he rest in the peace of Christ.

Today is World Mission Sunday.

Since 1926, the Church has remembered its universal mission. It is a special day set aside by Propagation of the Faith so that Catholics worldwide can rededicate themselves to the missionary work of the Church by prayer and action. Every parish in the world celebrates this day on the same date. Pope Francis released his annual Message for World Mission Sunday 2020 on Pentecost Sunday with the theme taken from Isaiah: "Here am I, send me"

6:8). Each of us is a missionary by virtue of our Baptism. Jesus commanded His disciples, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned". (Mark 16: 15- 16) At present missionaries are desperately in need of support in many poorer parishes in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. We can assist them by prayer and financial help. The money is used to build schools and churches and for the education of priests. We pray for missionaries, for those who provide the support for their missions and for those who welcome them.
