Advent is a Time to Prepare to Receive Jesus

The first Sunday of Advent we begin a new liturgical year. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord, and one of the key themes of the season is watchful waiting. The season of Advent is a time of waiting, which traditionally is defined as preparation. Advent provides a wonderful opportunity to consider what is going on inside me, to reflect on the reason for our waiting: the arrival of Jesus, the arrival of love, in our hearts in evernew ways.

A Season of Hope

During this season, we light the First Candle on the Advent Wreath, symbolizing hope. Hope is not merely wishful thinking; it is a confident expectation that God's promises will be fulfilled. In the midst of 'dark clouds over the sky', what gets lost is Hope- a hope in a better world, a hope in overcoming the situation, a hope in life and a hope in the lord. As messengers of Hope, we are called to be the salt of the earth and light of the world.

Slow Down To Silence the Distractions

In the busyness of our lives, it's easy to lose sight of the spiritual significance of Advent. Sometimes due to our weakness we lose sight of god and lose hope. It's a season which invites us to slow down, to silence the distractions, silence the unpleasant dreams and to turn our hearts and minds toward God's presence and also to wake from the slumber. Advent invites us to cultivate a spirit of watchfulness, not just for the signs of return, but opportunities God places before us daily to grow in Faith, Hope and Love. And to be faithful servants.

As we begin our Advent journey, let us reflect on our hearts: Have we grown complacent in faith or allowed sin to distance us from God? Now is the time to awaken, be watchful, and zealously fulfill our responsibilities. This season invites us to rekindle our devotion and recommit to discipleship, waiting eagerly for the birth of our Redeemer. As we light the first Advent candle, may it symbolize Christ's light guiding our hearts and filling us with hope.

Fr. Michael O'Loughlin 1935 - 2024



Michael was born to Peter and Margaret O'Loughlin on the 29th September, 1935. Educated at the Convent of Mercy, Ennis CBS Primary and Secondary Schools, he studied for the Priesthood at St. Columban's College, Dalgan Park, Navan, Co. Meath, where he was ordained on 21st December, 1960.

His missionary journey as a Columban Priest brought him to Korea, the United States and here in Ireland for the past twenty years. Michael had notable characteristics determination, single mindedness, independence, a 'free thinker', a man with a big intellect who had a thirst for knowledge big intellect who had a thirst for knowledge and a curiosity about new ideas, right up to Lord be with us during the month of December, and a curiosity about new ideas, right up to his death.

In his missionary work he was an advocate for justice and peace wherever he saw it lacking. He was a leader, a diplomat, a writer, a was passionate about proclaiming the Gospel Message.

In recent times with declining health he returned to live and be cared for by his Columban Community in Dalgan Park. Following a short illness he died peacefully in Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, Drogheda on Tuesday 19th November. His Funeral Mass took place in St. Columban's, Dalgan Park on Friday 22nd November, eve of the Feast of St. Columban with burial in the Community Cemetery.

To his sisters Peggy, Maureen, Eileen and Pat and their families and his Columban Family, we offer our sympathy and thanks. May Fr. Michael's soul rest in peace.
