John summons us to prepare the way of the Lord Jesus so that Christ may pass through our life without delay. If we are going to ask John about what we do in order to make straight the Lord's path in our life, he would tell us plainly to change our selfish way and think of others in life. John asked people to share, the tax collectors not to cheat and the soldiers not to use violence. Lord help us to be conscious that you are with us throughout this week, help us to be generous caring and kind, as we see Christ in the people we meet and they will meet a reflection of Christ goodness in us.

Today is also Bambinelli Sunday. A beloved annual tradition at the Basilica [Rome] in preparation for Christmas, the Blessing of the Bambinelli was first instituted by St. John Paul II. On the Third Sunday of Advent, the children of Rome are encouraged to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from each of their Nativity sets to St. Peter's Square. Following the Sunday Angelus address, the Pope blesses the figurines. Now celebrated in other churches around the world, this Advent tradition is a way for children to connect their Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at their church.

We pray that with your Blessing these images of Jesus, who is about to come among us, may be a sign of your presence and love in our homes. 

Gaudete Sunday



The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, the day when we light the pink candle on the Advent Wreath.

Rose vestments are worn to emphasise our joy that Christmas

is near. Gaudete means 'rejoice'. This day reminds us of the joy that is to come, and serves, amid this season of penance, as a kind of 'break' when we recall the hope we have because of the coming of Our Lord Je-SUS.



Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
