FEAST-PRESENTATION OF THE LORD -WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE Trilogy of days YEAR C 2nd February 2025

St Brigid, Presentation of Jesus in the temple, St Blaise

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the law of the Moses, the parent's of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord" Luke 2:22,.

Today's middle day of these trilogy of days, the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, marks a significant day in the life of Jesus and for Mary and Joseph. Fulfilling the custom for Jesus, Mary and Joseph have a chance meeting with the wise man Simeon, whose eyes saw in the young Jesus the one who had been promised by God .. Seeing in Jesus the one to be "a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of the people Israel" Luke2:32.

Yesterday's Feast of St Brigid brings to mind the wise woman of our tradition who also saw in Jesus one who could enlighten the people of her day, the great Chieftan too, with great faith in Jesus as the one who shed light for her path and life journey, one who had consecrated her life to Christ to fulfil her mission of taking Jesus into her heart and making him known to her people as one who could accompany her and them through life and after.

The third day, Feast day of St Blaise, follows the tradition surrounding the fourth century Bishop from Armenia, a Physician before becoming a Bishop who reputedly cured a boy who nearly died from choking with a fish bone ... from the ight century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat ... so in that tradition we avail of the ritual of Blessing of the throat on his Feast day.

Two candles placed by our throat, with the words prayed ... "Through the intercession of St Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

With these trilogy of days, we walk over the threshold of Springtime as creation undergoes a rebirth with the promise of emerging light. As the days get longer and more light emerges day by day, may we with the wise man Simeon, marvel with our eyes in seeing Jesus as " a light to the nations".

May we look upon the rushes woven into the iconic St Brigid's cross to represent the strands of our lives woven into a life with the Christ of the cross of Calvary and of Risen light. May we see in the frailty of illness renewed strength in the ritual of blessing enabling us to walk into each day with gratitude and courage.

The St Brigid Cross

Brigid wove a cross of rushes by a dying chieftain's bed" "Brigid what is that you're making From the rushes there?", he said.

Brigid said,"A cross I'm weaving, like the cross where Jesus died."

"Who was Jesus?" asked the chieftain, "Why was this man crucified?" Brigid told the gospel story to a dying pagan King.

Lying silently he listened, Never saying anything. Then he kissed the cross of rushes Saying ,"Brigid, thanks to you, I have come to love this Jesus, I will follow his way too!"

Since all the children share the same blood and flesh, Jesus too shared equally in it, so that by his death he could take away all the power of the devil, who had power over death, and set free all those who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a com-passionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human sins. That is, because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Luke 2:22-40

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord - observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord - and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God: and he said:

"Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised;

because my eyes have seen the salvation

which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel."

As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected and a sword will pierce your own soul too - so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem. When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.

The Gospel of the Lord.

Profession of Faith

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
