The words of that song and the heartfelt renditions that we may have contributed to remind us of the power of words. How often have I said 'I give you my word?' or we use the phrase 'Upon my word' to copper fasten what we want to emphasise. Yes, words are important. In our Gospel this weekend we have much emphasis on the Word. John's gospel begins with the line 'In the beginning was the Word'. The Word is mentioned through today's gospel. times many Christmas celebrates 'The Word became flesh'. Jesus the Christ was born so that we could encounter the Word.

And what does the Word mean to us as we begin a New Year? We are being called to celebrate a jubilee Year of Hope. A year during which we are being asked to reflect on the calling of each baptised Christian to be a Pilgrim of Hope. Most of us do not go on

Tomorrow, is Nollaig na mBan, small Christmas. In the eastern church January 6th is their big celebration of Christmas. May the Word guide us to continue telling the story of Christmas. A story which we are asked not to forget as we are pilgrims on a synodal pathway guided by the Holy Spirit and together in the Word.

'The Word was the true light that enlightens all people'.

May 2025 be a year where the light of peace will shine on our world and may all peoples share the pilgrim pathway of solidarity and may we never lose hope as we have the words in our gospel;

'A light that shines in the dark, a light that darkness could not overpower.'

Poor Clare Monastery Died 17th December, 2024

Sr. Francis, daughter of the late Thomas and Mary Collins was a proud Ballyea Lady. Born eighty-seven years ago, Francie, as she was affectionately known, was educated in Ballyea School and the Vocational School, Ennis, now known as Ennis Community College.

Prior to entering the Poor Clares' Sr. Francis worked in Western Garages, Ennis and Clare County Council. She entered the Poor Clare Monastery, Nun's Island, Galway but shortly afterwards transferred to the newly founded community of Poor Clares' here in Ennis in 1960. Later on she volunteered to her fellow sisters in the Poor Clare Monastery in Belfast.

She served as Federal Secretary of the Poor Clares', which involved visiting all monasteries in the Federation. She was the first Clare Lady to enter the new community here in Ennis and was a real community person, completely unselfish, forgiving and non-judgmental.

In recent years, she suffered from ill health that necessitated visits to hospital and eventually made her new home in Cahercalla Community Hospital where she became an important part of the care of patients and staff by her presence, prayer and listening ear for all.

Francis died peacefully in Ennis Hospital on Tuesday Night 17th December. Her Funeral Mass took place on Friday 20th December in the Monastery Chapel where she prayed every day. This was followed by cremation in Shannon Crematorium. Sr. Francis' ashes will be laid to rest in St. Clares' section of the Columbarium in our Cathedral.

In the words of St. John of the Cross –

'In the evening of our life we shall be examined on love.'

To Mother Abbess and her sisters here in the Poor Clares' we offer our sympathy, prayer and support as you mourn the death of Sr. Francis.
