Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the river Jordan. It was an important event in the history of redemption. Jesus began his public life. Each gospel lays emphasis on the anointing of Jesus with the Holy Spirit at his baptism. The heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descend like a dove and alight on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with him I am well pleased. Listen to him.' (Matthew 3:16-17). All the gospels refer to the heavens opening. With the power of the Holy Spirit Jesus went around doing good and thwarting the power of sin. From the beginning of Christianity there is a close connection between the baptism of Christ and our baptism. We were baptised in the name of the Blessed Trinity. We can reflect on this and on our lives today. We can also renew our baptismal vows. The Holy Spirit works quietly helping us to live according to the gospel.

Come O Holy Spirit; Enlighten us in everything we do, Guide us on our way through life, And direct us to everlasting life. Amen.
