1927 - 2016

A native of Carhunamadra, Kilnaboy, Sr. Concilio (Gertrude) Mackey, in her ninetieth year, died peacefully at St. Xavier's Convent on St. Patrick's Day, in the loving care of the Staff and Community. The youngest of a family of three, she was predeceased by her sister Mary and is survived by her sister Tessie.

Gertrude entered the Ennis Convent in June 1945 and made final profession of vows in August 1951. Blessed with energy and good health Sr. Consilio – or Connie as she was affectionately known - ministered to others unstintingly all her life, working in many areas of responsibility within the community. She was a gifted carer whose generosity knew no bounds. Connie was a woman of strong faith and believed that she always encountered Christ in those to whom she ministered.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 10:34.37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.

Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the country-side of Judea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand.

Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead.

It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
