# CALLED TO BE PEOPLE OF HOPE

Sundays:

In the second reading the early Christian community is told that their conduct should be such that their persecutors will be put to shame. They were told to have their answers ready for the people who ask them the reasons

for their hope. Hope in the face of sickness, trouble, persecution or death is puzzling.

ope is the virtue that enables us to look to the future with confidence. Jesus told his disciples that he was going to the Father but he did not leave them without hope for the future. He sent them the Holy Spirit. The power of the Spirit is what gives us hope. With the power of the Spirit we can face all trouble with trust and confidence.

That same Spirit that was given to the first Christians is also given to us, We need that power of the Spirit as we struggle with the crisis that faces our church today. We hear people moaning about the shortage of priests, low Mass attendance, lack of faith in Religious people, the dominant catholic church etc etc. The news is depressing. But we must never forget that the church is God's church and we



are God's people. While we long for old securities and the stability that goes with them we also need to be listening to the voice of the Spirit speaking to us. What is God calling us to? In the Gospel today Jesus is asking us to be a community that gives witness to God's Spirit working among us. To be a community that trusts that the Holy Spirit is guiding us to be where God wants us to be. With the Holy Spirit guiding us we can puzzle people with the hope that is evident among us.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people. Kindle in us the fire of your love that will fill us with trust and hope in your care of us.
