
Here I am Lord – Send me

increasingly difficult. The Bishop appealed for a greater understanding in an effort to overcome this crisis.



Looking to the future requires that we need not succumb to a nostalgic expectation that the trend

will reverse itself. What is required is that we support the Church that models itself on the teachings of Christ and the new directives that are being called for in the light of this deteriorating situation. The Church is calling on the faithful to nurture the seeds that are being planted and cherish it's fruit despite the negative vibes that tend to defame the role of the Church in society.

During the past few years the Diocese of Killaloe drew up a Pastoral Plan which called for a formula to meet the pastoral and spiritual needs of the Diocese. It became clearly evident that the ageing pattern of priests and religious was a source of serious concern and practical solutions to overcome the

Sr. Elizabeth O'Malley died peacefully on Friday 07 July 2017 in the loving care of the Community and Care Staff at St. Xavier's Convent, Bóthar na Trócaire, Ennis. The sixth of nine children, she is survived by her brother Fr. Frank, her other siblings having predeceased

Born in Glasnevin, Dublin, in 1924, Adeline Patricia (Ada) entered St. Xavier's Convent of Mercy, Ennis in September 1944 taking Elizabeth as her religious name. Her aunt, Sr. Celestine Hickey, was already a member of the Ennis community.

Having obtained her Degree and Higher Diploma from NUI Galway. Elizabeth joined the staff of Coláiste Muire. Ennis. She later moved to Killaloe where she served as principal of St. Anne's Secondary School before returning again to Ennis. She will be remembered by generations of Coláiste Muire students not just for her teaching and production of school shows, but for instilling in students a real love of music and a confidence in developing their musical talents. She will be remembered by generations of Ennis parishioners as director of the Cathedral and Cloughleigh church choirs; she will also be remembered in Shannon as director of the Parish choir there. Wherever she went Elizabeth's kindness and easy way endeared her to everyone. She retired to St. Xavier's in 2009. To the very end, she was a faith-filled, friendly and fun-loving person - and a true Dub! - who had time for everyone and loved to celebrate. Up to one year ago she sat at the piano and played most afternoons. May she rest in peace as she joins the choirs of heaven.
