Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God 1st January 2017 (Year A)

Sundays:

At the birth of the New Year we honour Mary, through whom Christ entered into our world. At the gate of the new year we entrust ourselves and our world to Mary, the Gate of Heaven. But who is this woman? What do we know about her? Why is she so important to us?

Primarily, and this is very important, Mary is one of us. She is fully human, not a supernatural being, not part of the Godhead, or the missing part of the trinity. She is not

some reflection of the Goddess myth in ancient religion. She is one of us. However, there is something crucial to recognise.

She is one of us, made special by the grace of God. Her titles (of which there are many) 'Blessed Virgin' 'Theotokos' 'Queen of Heaven', are titles of grace, not of right. Because she did what the


Angel asked of her, because she kept the faith, right through and beyond the end, because she showed us how to be a disciple of Christ, and took on a role for which she was not prepared; for all these reasons, she wins favour with God.

And that, my dear friends, shows us the way. If we have the faith to follow God's call, to venture out of our comfort zones to live the Gospel, then we can be similarly blessed, filled with grace as the angel said. The opportunity to be lifted up with such grace is available to all who have faith, and we can learn from her example how to become true disciples of faith. As Pope St. John Paul II once said, *"Never hesitate to look to Mary as a sure guide amid the trials of life."*



Here in today's Gospel text, we see why Our Lady is a model of faith for all of us: her response to the shepherds – indeed her response to the wise men, to the Angel Gabriel, to the presentation in the temple, in fact to all that God reveals to her is to treasure these things in her heart, to ponder, to reflect, to draw upon them; perhaps over years. many It is the

prayerful, contemplative response to God that Our Lady makes, which should be our mark as Christians, and which I want to set as our challenge for this coming year – to make 2017 a praying year, a year where we draw closer to the heart of God in prayer and seek to do God's will, both as a parish and as individuals. Sr. Clare O'Neill RIP



In her ninety fourth year, Sr. Clare O'Neill died peacefully on the 14 December 2016 in Cahercalla Community Hospital, Ennis. A native of Kilkerrin, Labasheeda, Co. Clare, she was the youngest of seven children, all of whom have pre-deceased her. She entered St. Xavier's Convent of Mercy, Ennis, in 1942 and made final Profession of Vows in 1948.

Having trained as a nurse in Cork, Clare took up a post in 1952 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Ennis where she was highly regarded for her gentle, caring and thorough attention to the elderly patients. In 1977 she joined the Mercy mission in Iceland where she spent seven happy years. She later cared for the sick in St. Xavier's for many years and contributed to the Killaloe Apostolic Works Society. Above all Clare was a woman of deep faith and prayer with a particular devotion to Our Blessed Lady.

Sr. Clare will be sadly missed by her many nieces and nephews, her extended family, a wide circle of friends and by her Mercy Community.
