The Presence of God was the principal characteristic in the lives of our ancestors. This was based on the belief that God was always near, looking after and interested in them. We know that we can communicate with God at all times during the day no matter what we are doing. We can pray at every moment and offer all our actions to God as we do when we say the Morning Offering and often during the day no matter what the task in hand. This was the custom of our ancestors. They said short, simple prayers which did not distract from their work but raised their hearts to God in love. These are a few examples which have come to us from folklore.

Lord hold my hand when I flounder in deep waters. Virgin Mary stay with me when troubles abound. Amen. A hundred thousand welcomes sweet Lord, Son of Mary I love you, in your mercy come to me, King of Heaven. Amen. Prayer said at the beginning of work:

Direct we beseech you, O Lord all our actions by your holy inspirations and carry them by your gracious assistance, that every prayer and work of ours may begin always with you and through thee be happily ended, through Christ Our Lord .Amen
