Beatitudes – Attitudes of Being

Somewhere, Mark Twain commented that the sections of the New Testament giving him the most trouble were not those he couldn't understand but rather the sections he could.


The Beatitudes are like that. They are a simple, and yet controversial, guide to life that throws down the gauntlet to popular human values.

Pope Francis described them as a "programme", the "identity card of a Christian". If you ask yourself how to become a good Christian; this is where you can find Jesus's answer, an answer that points to an attitude that is currently very much against the tide:

The world tells us that happiness, joy and entertainment are the best things in life. And it looks the other way when there are problems of pain in the family of faith. The world does not want to suffer, it prefers to ignore painful situations, to cover them up. Only the person who sees things as they are, and whose heart mourns, will be happy and will be comforted.

Few words, simple words, but practical for all that. Christianity is a practical religion: it is not just to be imagined, it is to be practiced.

As we enter Catholic Schools Week we are reminded that education is not just about the transmission of information — true education runs much deeper and draws out the innate goodness that is at the heart of all of us who are created in the image and likeness of God.



We pray this week in thanksgiving for all the partners who strive to create effective Catholic Schools in our community and cultivate the attitudes of being that make our world a better place to be and live!



Naomh Eoin Bosco (1815-1888)

Beidh Lá Fhéile Naomh Eoin Bosco á chomóradh ag an Eaglais ar an Mháirt seo chugainn. Rugadh Naomh Eoin Bosco ar 16 Lúnasa 1815 i Piedmont san Iodáil. Caitlicigh an-tugtha do Dhia ab ea a theaghlach. Fuair a athair bás nuair a bhí Eoin dhá bhliain d'aois agus bhí ar a mháthair soláthair dá triúr mac. Bhí tionchar nach beag aici orthu. De bharr na bochtaineachta, ní bhfuair sé aon scolaíocht agus chaith sé tús a shaoil mar aoire. Fuair sé a chéad oideachas ó shagart paróiste a chuaigh i bhfeidhm go mór air agus a spreag é chun bheith ina shagart. Ba mhian a chroí é cabhrú leis an aos óg agus go mór mór le páistí bochta. Bhunaigh sé Cuallacht na Sailéisineach sa bhliain 1852 chun freastal ar na hoibre sin. Bhí an - mhuinín aige as Dia agus as an Mhaighdean Mhuire. Chloígh sé gach deacracht i gcúrsaí a chuid oibre le cúnamh Dé. Fuair se bás sa bhliain1888. Naomhainmnigh an Pápa Pius X1 é sa bhliain 1934. A Dhia, a roghnaigh Naomh Eoin Bosco le bheith mar athair agus oide ag an aos óg nuair a chuir sé cuallachtaí nua ar bun san Eaglais, gríosaigh le lasracha na carthanachta sinne, do thoil a dhéanamh ar an saol seo .Áiméan

Next Tuesday is the feast of Saint John Bosco. He was born in Piedmont in Italy in 1815. His family was very religious. His father died when he was two years old and his mother reared their three sons. She influenced John Bosco greatly. Because of poverty he received no formal education and he spent his life as a shepherd. He was educated later by a priest who influenced him and led him to priesthood. He desired to help youths especially the poor. He founded the Salesian Order in 1852 for this work. He had great faith in God and Our Lady. He overcame all difficulties in his work with the help of God. He died in 1888. He was canonised by Pope Pius X1 in 1934. Lord, who chose Saint John Bosco to be father and teacher of youth when he founded a religious order in the Church, inspire us through a spirit of charity to do your will throughout our lives.
