

Language Worthy Of The Awesome Mystery Of God



A frequent question, especially in light of the translation of the third edition of the Roman Missal, concerns the language of the Mass. Why do the words of Mass sound so different from the language we use in everyday life?

Human beings express spiritual realities through cultural language, gestures and actions. Thus the Catechism teaches that one source for understanding Mass is found in human culture. Every culture has its own language. Every language develops within the context of a particular culture.

Eskimo culture, for example, uses many different words for "snow." French culture has an entire vocabulary focused on wine and wine-making and another for bread and bread-making.

The medical profession uses vocabulary that you or I probably never use when they record diagnoses or treatment plans. Why? Because when it comes to critical life or death issues, the language of the street can lack the pinpoint precision and clarity required to ensure the patient gets appropriate treatment.

We know instinctively to use a particular kind of language that is suited to the circumstances or occasion: we speak to children one way, but use different linguistic registers when speaking to loved ones, friends, colleagues, or employers.

Something similar occurs in the Mass. When speaking of the awesome mystery which is God, we use language that is appropriate to the context and the solemnity of the occasion. The language of the Mass is not the language of Main Street, USA, (or Main, St Ennis, for that matter), but of Main Street, Heaven.

Our task is to make our language less like this world and more like that of the world to come.



Remembering Our Dead Wednesday, 1st November Feast of All Saints

The annual Remembrance Mass will take place on Thursday Nov 2nd (*Feast of All Souls*), at 7.30pm in The Cathedral. We will remember all our dead but especially those who have been bereaved during the last year. The names of the dead will be carried to the altar at the beginning of the Mass. All welcome.

Hallowe'en, comes from the early name for Nov 1st, All Saints' Day. This holyday remembers the Saints that are not honoured with a Feast Day. In the Celtic tradition *Ofche Shamhna*, was one of their four sacred feasts, remembering spirits of the dead. Our dead are part of the Communion of Saints and in November we particularly remember them.

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2nd November: All Souls

Traditionally, on this day & especially during all of November, we visit a church or graveyard to pray for our dead.

Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls

From 12 noon on Nov 1st to midnight on Nov 2nd, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father & Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice), can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father & the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made any time within the week preceding or the week following Nov 1st. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions, once per day from Nov 1st to 8th. The conditions mentioned above, apply also for this.

Ennis Parish Mass Time Changes

As you will be aware, since the Killaloe Diocesan changes during the summer, two of our Ennis priests are now serving the parishes of Quin and Tulla. This means that an additional six masses have been added to the weekend schedule of the Ennis clergy. As a result of these changes and not wishing to put extra pressure on our retired clergy we have undertaken a review of the weekend mass times in the Ennis Parish.

We have endeavoured to ensure the best possible sacramental service in our parish at the weekends. However this has meant that it is necessary to cut back on the number of masses celebrated in the parish on Sundays. We have taken the time to consult as widely as possible by survey, by census count and discussion at parish council and cluster level to ensure that in spite of the necessity of cutting back on the number of masses we offer people as wide a choice as possible in the town.

We are conscious of people's devotion to particular masses which they have traditionally attended for many years and regret any disappointment that this necessary change may cause. The current timetable for the Vigil Masses on Saturday evening will remain the same. The Cathedral, St. Joseph's, The Friary and Cahercalla Hospital will each lose a Sunday Mass. Despite the reduction in the number of masses there are still 13 masses each weekend in Ennis. We have tried in so far as possible to ensure that there is a mass starting almost every half hour in town between 7.45am and 12noon on Sunday. The new timetable is outlined below and will come into effect on the First Sunday in Advent on Sunday 3rd December 2017. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation. There will be no change to the current weekday mass schedule for the time
